

Duke University Asian and African Languages and Literature Fall 2006: Elementary Arabic I

Course Description

This course is an elementary level of Modern Standard Arabic (MSA), which is spoken and written throughout the 21 countries of the Arab world. It is designed to introduce students to the basic skills of reading, listening, writing and speaking. The class focuses on pronunciation, phonology and writing the Arabic alphabet. Gradually, through exploring the drills, exercises and class discussion, students will develop oral and aural proficiency for communication and learn the fundamental structure of basic sentences.

Class will depend on simple interactive tasks involving teacher to students and student-to-student, and extensive listening exercises to develop communicative skills. Culture across the Arab world is an integral part of this course. Arab culture will be explored through the reading, audiovisual materials, the *aswaat arabiyah* site, film and outside class activities.

General objectives of elementary Arabic

The successful student who completes the two elementary levels will meet the proficiency level of novice high as outlined in the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) efficiency guidelines. He or she will acquire the basic knowledge of the following skills:

- **a. Listening:** Understand a basic spoken MSA, able to grasp a meaning of short passage, understand simple one-to-one conversation and get simple conversation and directions
- **b. Speaking:** Able to express oneself and participate in simple one-to-one conversations involving basic practical and social situations such as introduction, greetings, home and family issues, work and simple instructions
- **c. Reading:** Read Arabic materials of limited complexity and variety. Able to read and understand simple description, narrative and comprehend list of items dealing with personal and social needs.
- **d.** Writing: Able to write simple notes, letters, and personal experiences. Able to supply information on basic simple forms such as hotel registration, passport and other travel documents.

Specific objectives of Elementary I

a. Develop proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing in MSA. The class starts with pronunciation, phonology writing the Arabic alphabet.

- **b. Practice basic grammatical structures.** Gradually, through exploring the drills, exercises and class discussion, students will develop basic communicative skills and learn the fundamental structure of basic sentences.
- c. Understand Arab culture through class materials, discussion, Internet, film and outside activities.

How can you meet these objectives?

- ✓ Participate actively and fully in class using all vocabulary and structures that you learn all the time and as much as you can.
- ✓ Do not get frustrated in case you forget a vocabulary, rule or make a mistake.

 Language learning is a process that requires dedication and patience.
- ✓ Do all the assignments; studying in groups or recurring to tutors, myself or the TA, is NOT a sin.
- ✓ Inform the instructor about any problem you have that might be preventing you from learning successfully.

- ✓ Remember, Arabic is a Semitic language, poetic in its nature and classical in its structure, so it requires some memorization.
